## FROM YOUR CHAPTER EDUCATOR

**Bob Chute**



Most of you have probably heard of the Hurt Report. (That's Hugh Hurt Jr., NOT injured in a crash). Anyway, it's a report published way back in 1981. But it still applies. There has not been another as-in-depth-study done since. This report took an in-

depth look at motorcycle crash causes and countermeasures. The format of this newsletter is too small to do any kind of in-depth summary of that report. I encourage all of you to look it up on the internet as it is very enlightening. It's also in the book mentioned below which is very good.

Here are a few interesting facts published in that report. I think this may help everyone kind-of re-think the hazards out there.

### Crash Causes:

Multivehicle . . . . .	74%
Left-turners . . . . .	28%
Angle Collisions . . . . .	29%
Other . . . . .	18%
Single Vehicle . . . . .	26%
Rider Error . . . . .	17%
Animals, Blowouts, Etc. . . . .	6%
Surface Hazards . . . . .	2%

### Experience Riding in Traffic:

(Note: 1 indicates average of those studied. Numbers greater than 1 indicate higher than average accident involvement. Lower than 1 is less than average.)

0 – 6 months . . . . .	1.4
7 – 12 months . . . . .	.096
13 – 24 months . . . . .	0.93
25 – 36 months . . . . .	1.52
37 – 48 months . . . . .	0.98
48 months + . . . . .	.083

I thought this statistic was particularly interesting in that it seems after about 2 years of riding one gets complacent about attention to traffic and the accident rate increases, almost twice as high as someone with more than 4 years experience. Most of us are in the 48 months + category, which is the lowest. But those who are relative newbies, or are right around the 2 year point, be extra careful. The Parking Lot Practice is a good way to get a jump start on getting your skills back after the long winter. *Be there!!!*

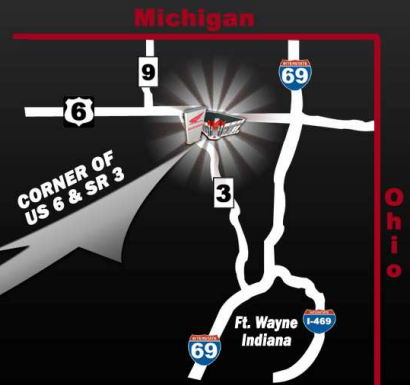
